#### Thought for the Week\*

This week's Thought for the Week focused on **Road Safety Week**. Students engaged in discussions and scenario-based activities to explore the importance of road safety, with key messages including:

- Young people are at higher risk of crashes due to factors like speed, inexperience, distraction, or peer pressure.
- Risky road behaviours such as speeding or driving under the influence have severe consequences. Responsibility toward others on the road is essential.
- Avoiding the term "accidents" emphasises that many road incidents are preventable.
- Speaking up when feeling unsafe due to someone else's reckless driving is important to create a culture of safety.
- Reflecting on the human impact of road crashes encourages empathy and responsibility.

#### In the News

This week saw the launch of our new **Mind Matters** programme. Held twice per half-term, these sessions aim to:

- Raise awareness of emotional literacy and resilience.
- Help students develop the skills to identify and manage their emotions healthily.
- Provide a safe space for students to explore emotional literacy and resilience. The ultimate goal is for students to apply these skills in their daily lives and across the school community, building confidence and emotional strength.




