In the News

This week's In the News segment focused on marking the **International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women**. Through discussion and debate, students explored the following key messages:

- Violence against women and girls (VAWG) is a global issue affecting millions, including in the UK.
- ➤ VAWG can take many forms—physical, sexual, psychological, emotional, and financial—and it is important to recognise that violence by intimate partners or family members is still violence.
- The prevalence of VAWG affects the experiences and behaviours of women and girls, often making them feel unsafe and limiting their freedoms.
- Social media can act as both a tool for activism and awareness and, unfortunately, as a platform for spreading hate or sexist attitudes.
- Politicians have various tools to combat VAWG, focusing on either prevention or reaction. Prevention is key to eradicating this issue in the long term.

Other News

- ➤ Year 7 and 8 students impressed us all by representing their year groups and Houses in PE House events. The competition was intense, and every participant did themselves proud!
- ➤ Year 11 students completed their mock exams in practical subjects and continued working on post-16 applications during Pastoral Curriculum Time.
- Interested Year 11 students also attended a visit from CRE8, which provided valuable insights for their future endeavours.
